- Serve children and young adults from throughout Virginia who have severe intellectual and physical disabilities
- 24/7 clinical care, difficult to achieve at home
- Long-term residential and short-stay care
- 275-plus employees

Residents

- Up to 88 residents, newborn to 21, at St. Mary's Home
- Plus 12 residents over 21 at The Albero House for adults on St. Mary's campus (opened in 2013)
- Birth disorders, traumatic accidents, illness, child abuse
- Referred by hospitals, physicians, social workers, community service boards, teachers, families



Services

- Facility-run occupational, physical and recreational therapies
- Regular exams by specialists from Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters and EVMS
- Infant and Toddler Program, with infant massage
- Summer camps, year-round activities and community outings

Features

- Four courtyards, including sensory and butterfly gardens, hydrotherapy pool and playground with specially adapted equipment
- Atrium for sports and activities
- Beautifully landscaped grounds, including gazebo
- Centrally located – easy access to beaches, theme parks

Education

- Eight educational classrooms
- Partnership with Southeastern Cooperative Educational Programs
- Classes onsite led by master's-prepared teachers, or in public schools as requested
- Virginia Alternative Assessments, alternative to Standards of Learning for public schools

Costs

- Covered by Medicaid, with additional funding by United Way, grants, individual, corporate and municipal donations, and St. Mary's Foundation
